### **Learning Objectives:**

- 1. "Present a creative project that synthesizes and interprets information collected from various disciplines."
- 2. "Illustrate how one's perception of time and place impacts attitudes and behaviors toward the natural world."

**Due Date**: December 3

**Grade-Point Value**: 200 points, 20% of final grade (see scoring rubric on reverse side)

**Instructions**: Your assignment is three-fold:

- 1. Create a piece of art that engages our "Time and Environment" course theme;
- 2. Write a short, personal essay explaining how your art "synthesizes" the artistic, scientific, and socio-cultural approaches to our "Time and Environment" course theme; and
- 3. Exhibit your project to the class.

#### Guidelines are as follows:

- 1. The artwork should either be fabricated from at least one sustainable component (including recycled parts, as a quilt or "found art" sculpture might) or directly express a message about the need for an experience of time that promotes a sustainability ethic (as a song or a poem might).
- 2. **Your creative process** should include conscious invocation of certain attitudes, which you will describe in your personal essay, including:
  - **Perspectives of time** you learned about this semester that may be different from your "norm."
  - **Awareness of shifting from consumer to artist**, as explained by Satish Kumar in his "Art for Earth's Sake" essay (Canvas), moving *away* from "being mere consumers of goods and services," and *toward* "a state where we humans are active participants in the process of life in the making of things which are beautiful, useful, and durable."
- 3. The short, personal essay (approximately 500 words) should
  - Be organized around a thesis, stated in the first paragraph, that answers these three questions, establishing your "synthesis" of our course's interdisciplinary focus:
    - o **Art perspective:** What is the title of your piece, and what art medium does it represent?
    - **Scientific perspective:** How does your art represent scientific concepts of environmental sustainability?
    - o **Socio-cultural perspective**: What concepts of time perspective learned this semester did you experience, imagine, or attempt to represent in your creative work? *Optional addition*: Does your art derive from any socio-cultural artistic tradition?

- Use appropriate terminology to describe applicable scientific and socio-cultural concepts, as learned from the textbook, lectures, and handouts<sup>2</sup> such as
  - o Cunningham & Cunningham's Principles of Environmental Science glossary
  - o "Introduction to Culture, Activity Orientation, & Worldviews"
  - o "Cultural Perspectives on Time"
- 4. **Artist statement:** On an index card to be displayed with your art, include your name, the title of the piece, a brief summary of your "synthesis" thesis, described above, and any other information about the piece that you want viewers to consider as they examine your work.
