Unfolding the Secret

EDUCATORS ARE ALWAYS LOOKING for ways to teach and improve basic math and reading skills, encourage critical thinking and problem solving, nurture creativity, introduce students to other cultures, and foster cooperation and socialization. All this can be learned from the ancient art of origami.

ORIGAMI: Unfolding the Secret presents paper folding of all shapes and sizes from around the world: dragons, stegosauruses, tsuru

("peace" cranes), horses, elephants, flower bouquets, boxes, fans, and more. Over 100 objects from Canada, China, Holland, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Korea, Russia, Singapore, and Vietnam are on display. Hands-on exhibits feature matching games, magnetic building rods, and tangram puzzles for students to manipulate and explore. Students even have the opportunity to create their own origami in Artmobile to take home. Drawn from the extensive collection of author and educator, Barbara Pearl, ORIGAMI: Unfolding the Secret is informing and delighting visitors of all ages while providing schools with an enriching opportunity for integrating arts across the curriculum and encouraging collaboration throughout the entire school community.

An Artmobile Educator meets each class individaully and engages students in a discussion about the art geared to their grade level and interests.

In addition, Teachers' Manuals are sent to each school prior to our visit to help teachers incorporate the Artmobile experience into their curricula. They provide background information on the exhibition, pre-visit and post-visit activities for all ages, a glossary, a bibliography and class handouts. The Teacher's Manual is intended both as a tool to enrich and extend the visit, and as a teacher resource for years to come. As an added bonus, each school will receive a copy of Ms. Pearl's acclaimed book Math in Motion: Origami in the Classroom as a resource for their library.

ORIGAMI: Unfolding the Secret is supported in part by Gene W. Fickes, Target, and the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts, a state agency funded by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.






ARTMOBILE will visit 37 schools and 5 public sites from September 2006 through June 2007, More than 20,000 school children and adults
