Group #3 - MATH 110; MATH 117; MATH 118 (BUSA 103); MATH 120;
MATH 122 (MATH 150); MATH 125 (MATH 150); MATH 140 (MATH 211).
Any of these course will fulfill the Core: Math requirement for the Psychology degree program
at Holy Family University.

The course grouping not selected at Bucks County Community College, will be fulfilled at Holy Family
University.

++ Select from the following courses to fulfill Science elective:

BIOL 102; CHEM 101, PHYS 106 (GSCI 110);
SCIE 103 (GSI108, a non-lab course at HF); SCIE 105(GSCI 105, a non-lab course at HF).

If elects PSYC 200 (PSYS 343) then will take PSYC 345 (Abnormal Psychology) at Holy Family. If
elects PSYC 280 (PSYC 345) at Bucks County will take PSYC 343 (Social Psychology) at Holy Family.
Both courses are required in the Psychology major – all tracks.

Course transfer will be determined by the track elected – the course will be a Psychology elective in
both the General Track, and the Research Track. The course will not fulfill any degree requirement in the
Mental Health Services Track.

@@ Both PSYC 323 (Quantitative Research) and PSYC 324 (Qualitative Research) are required for all
tracks in the Psychology program. The courses may be taken in any order.

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The three tracks in Psychology:

General Track: This track will appeal to students who wish to major in psychology but have no plans to go to graduate school or to enter the clinical area. This track prepares students with broad-based foundations in the basic areas of psychology, including psychological theory and research methods. The track emphasizes critical thinking, stresses the values inherent in the field of psychology and highlights the application of psychological theory of personal, social and organizational issues.

Mental Health Services Track: This track provides an opportunity for specialization for those students who wish to work in hands-on mental health positions following graduation. Coursework provides an introduction to various populations, including children, those with addictions, groups, and provides a solid foundation in theories of counseling.

Research Track: This track is designed for students wishing to pursue graduate study following completion of the baccalaureate degree. Coursework will prepare the student to apply to either master's or doctoral level programs in psychology and included advanced experience in research methods.

Additional information regarding PSYCHOLOGY concentration:

Successful completion of a comprehensive examination is required.

Note: A minimum of 60 credits must be earned at Holy Family University to be eligible for commencement honors.

Note: Course sequence progression is based on admission to Holy Family University for the Fall semester. Admitting in the Spring semester alters the program progression as outlined and will result in extending degree completion beyond the four semester sequence.
