- 1. Students who complete the A.A. in Business Administration (1009) at Bucks are included in the Bucks-Temple Core-to-GenEd Transfer Agreement, and therefore, have satisfied all of the GenEd requirements at Temple. A grade of C or better must be obtained in the above listed courses to meet Temple's requirements for transfer credit.
- 2. Students who complete Bucks' MGMT 135: Business Communications will still be required to complete Temple's BA 2196: Business Communications course at Temple. BA 2196 is a writing-intensive course and therefore cannot be satisfied via Transfer credit.
- 3. Students who are planning to major in Finance at Temple should select MATH 215: Elementary Statistics II. The combination of MATH 115 and MATH 215 can be used to fulfill the FSBM STAT 2103: Business Statistics Requirement via DARS exception. Finance majors who transfer without MATH 215 may require additional time to degree completion.
- 4. Students should select MGMT 180: Legal Environment of Business. MGMT 180 transfers to Temple as LGLS 1101: Legal Environment of Business and satisfies a major requirement.
- 5. Temple's Fox School of Business will waive STAT 1001: Pre-Calculus for Business through DARS exception, for students who transfer Bucks MATH 118: Business Calculus or MATH 140: Calculus I.
- 6. Students who transfer an equivalent of STAT 1102 will also be required to earn credit for BA 2104 Excel for Business Applications. Students who do not transfer an Excel course, must take BA 2104 in their first semester or pass the waiver exam to fulfill the requirement.
- 7. It is recommended that students take MGMT160, Insurance and Risk Management at Bucks to fulfill their elective credits, the course will transfer in as RMI 2101: Introduction to Risk Management





If the suggested classes are successfully completed and an Associate of Arts in Business Administration is awarded from Bucks County Community College, the remaining four semesters in the **Supply Chain Management** major at Temple University follows:
