Content Requirements for Subject-Area Tutors

Each subject area requires applicants to have earned an A in the following courses or their equivalents. Occasionally, a B+ will be accepted as well. This will be determined during the interview process based upon proficiency with the course content.

Current subject requirements are listed below; however, if you are interested in tutoring a subject area not listed below, please include that information in your application materials.

All subject areas require completion of a faculty-generated skills assessment or a conversation with a member of the subject area's faculty in order to verify proficiency with course content.

Accounting Tutors

- During the Interview the applicant will be asked to complete an accounting assessment to determine proficiency with course content.
